



Financial Aid Application Checklist

The Suzuki Violin School of Columbus – Worthington is pleased to offer two forms of financial aid – an Emergency Financial Assistance Scholarship, which offers one-time support, typically covering a portion of tuition for one quarter; and a Student Enrichment Scholarship, which covers a portion of tuition for an entire academic year (three quarters). Families are asked to complete an application to be considered for both of these financial aid packages and are asked for other pertinent information. All submissions for financial aid consideration must contain the following:

- School's Scholarship Application Form
- On a separate piece of paper, please state the following:
 - a) Current marital status (e.g., single, married, separated, divorced, widowed)
 - b) Names and ages of children
 - c) Length of requested lesson time
 - d) Total years of private instrumental study on primary instrument (for student who is requesting financial aid support)
 - e) Length of time student has studied with current private teacher on primary instrument
 - f) State whether applicant is receiving any other forms of financial aid and the amount of aid awarded
- Confidential Financial Statements
 - a) Federal and State Tax Forms (for most recent calendar year), accompanied by the appropriate schedules
 - b) W-2 forms
 - c) Records of any non-taxable income, such as veteran, social security, alimony, child support, pensions, trusts, partnerships, etc.
- Student Letter telling about him/herself and why he/she chooses to study music, and, specifically, violin through the Suzuki Violin School of Columbus – Worthington. (Depending on the age of the child, a letter from his/her parent will suffice.)
- Teacher Reference Letter – letter from teacher supporting why student should be considered for financial aid support
- Application signed and dated by applicant
